## FY2017 BUDGET SEES LOWER TAX RATE FOR RESIDENTS

The Village of Carpentersville's FY2017 General Fund Budget is \$30,612,603. One of the highlights of the FY2017 Budget, is the continued spending on infrastructure improvement projects to make Carpentersville a beautiful and sustainable place to work and live.


The overall tax levy will increase by \$166,341 (1.28%). However, the Village's portion of the estimated total tax rate will decrease by 12%, for a tax rate of 2.58% compared to last year's 2.93%. This decrease is primarily the result of the increase in the Village's EAV (Equalized Assessed Value). As the EAV rises, the corresponding tax rate can be lowered and still achieve the same tax levy dollars as the year before.

Accordingly, the Village is lowering its rate by keeping the corporate tax levy flat (\$7.5 million) and reducing the debt service levy. The Village could achieve the reduction in debt service levy because of the increased savings from the recent bond refunding. With the EAV going up, we are still able to run our general operations while also giving tax rate relief to our citizens, despite the annual increases to contractual and maintenance services, health insurance, union and non-union personnel wages, and other overhead costs.

The only increase to the tax levy is the result of a 10.88% increase in Police and Fire Pension costs. The Village is following the pension funds actuarial report regarding the need to fully fund our obligation to the Police and Fire Pensions. As such, the Village continues to fund both Police and Fire Pensions at a level that is higher than the State's mandated minimum funding level as it is the Village Board's intention to meet our local obligations rather than follow the poor example of the State of Illinois' insufficient pension funding practices.

The Village expects to close FY 2016 with a modest surplus in the General Fund.

## CARPENTER PARK PHASE 1 RENOVATION PROJECT

The Village of Carpentersville is beginning Phase 1 of the Carpenter Park Renovation Project. Improvements to the park will include installing a 9-hole for disc golf course, adding a sand volleyball court, updating the softball field, creating a path that connects to the regional bike trail, and building a gazebo. ## REMINDER: NEW TURN RESTRICTIONS

On Tuesday, September 6, the Carpentersville Village Board approved changes to the Municipal Code to address long-standing traffic issues at the following intersections:

### Main Street and Washington Street

No Straight Through: 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.  
*By prohibiting vehicles from going straight through the intersection, southbound on Washington Street, between the hours stated above, congestion around the intersection will be greatly reduced.*

### Main Street and Lincoln Avenue

No Left Turn: 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.  
*By prohibiting vehicles from making left turns on Lincoln Avenue between the peak hours stated above, congestion around the intersection will be greatly reduced.*

### Liberty School – 6500 Miller Road

No Left Turn into Liberty School: 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. \*WHEN SCHOOL IS IN SESSION\*  
*By prohibiting vehicles on Miller Road from making left turns into Liberty School between the hours stated above (when school is in session), congestion around the intersection will be greatly reduced.*

Signs warning drivers of these new restrictions have been posted at each of the three intersections.

## YARD WASTE AND GARBAGE COLLECTION REMINDERS

On Thanksgiving week, refuse, recycling, and yard waste services scheduled for collection on Thursday, November 24 will be delayed by one (1) day. Republic Services will continue to provide weekly yard waste collection for all single-family residents through November 30. All yard waste must be placed in biodegradable paper bags and not exceed 33 gallons in size and 50 pounds in weight. Christmas trees are collected from December 26 through January 31 at no additional charge. Make sure you remove exterior Holiday Decorations by January 31.

## TREE PLANTING PROGRAM UPDATE

On July 5, 2011, the Village of Carpentersville received notice from the Illinois Department of Agriculture confirming the presence of the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) within our community. As a result, 2,472 affected trees within the Village were marked for removal. To date the Village has removed 2,190 of the 2,472 affected trees. The Public Works Department has been working diligently to replace all trees on Village property that were affected by the EAB infestation and will continue to do so until all 2,472 trees are replaced. The Village has budgeted for an additional 400 trees to be replaced in 2017, which will bring the total number of trees replaced to 2,197.

# ENGINEERING DIVISION UPDATES – 2016 COMPLETED PROJECTS

## **BALL AVENUE EXTENSION**

New construction is complete for the Ball Avenue extension from LW Besinger Drive at the west; to the west entrance of the new Walmart Supercenter. Other improvements include shared-use roadway bike lane access and street lighting.

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## **CARPENTER CREEK RESTORATION PROJECT**

Floodplain improvements along Carpenter Creek from Maple Avenue to 1300+/- upstream are complete. These improvements will remove approximately 40 structures out of the existing floodplain, reduce nonpoint source pollution and increase water quality. Two separate IEPA grant applications (Section 319 & IGIG) were submitted. The Village was successful in receiving \$628,000 towards the estimated total cost of \$1.1 million for all improvements.

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## **2016 MFT / CDBG RESURFACING AND SIDEWALK PROGRAM**

Roadway improvements of Sioux Ave. from Papoose and Navajo, Greenwood Ave. from Greenwood Ct. to Maple Ave., Caddy Ave., from Ball to Hazard and Wren Rd. from Fairway to Hazard are complete. This work was funded with Motor Fuel Tax and CDBG funds received through a grant from Kane County Office of Community Reinvestment. Improvements included removal and replacement of existing carriageway, curb and gutter, ADA compliant upgrades, 2 inch asphalt resurfacing, select base repair, and pavement markings.

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## **2016 MFT RESURFACING AND SIDEWALK PROGRAM**

Roadway improvements within select streets of the Providence Point Subdivision are complete. This work was funded with Motor Fuel Tax funds. Improvements include removal and replacement of existing carriageway, curb and gutter, ADA upgrades, 2 inch asphalt resurfacing, select base repair, and pavement markings.

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## **HOPÍ LANE STORM SEWER STUDY**

An engineering study was completed to evaluate the existing storm sewer in areas near the northeast corner of IL 25 and Hopi Lane. The study will provide construction costs, design options, and recommended construction phasing. Once complete, the study will be used for the final design in 2017.

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## **RIVERSVIEW DRIVE AND CULVERT IMPROVEMENT PROJECT**

Construction improvements will be completed this fall for Riversview Drive, including the replacement of the existing failed culvert. Other improvements included path access for the Kane County Forest Pressure District's bike path, new street lights, and new storm sewer.

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## **WILLIAMS ROAD STORM SEWER STUDY AND DESIGN**

Preliminary engineering and final design was completed to evaluate the existing storm sewer along Williams Road north of Kings Road. This will provide a drainage study, construction costs, and final design for construction improvements in 2017.

## ENGINEERING UPDATES CONTINUED - 2017 STUDY AND DESIGN PHASE PROJECTS

### ROUTE 31 AT HUNTLEY/MAIN INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT


Final design is 95% complete and right-of-way acquisition is ongoing. Roadway improvements include intersection and approach widening and reconstruction and new traffic signals at Route 31 and Huntley Road. Intersection and approach widening and reconstruction will be completed at Main Street and Lincoln Ave., as well as the reconstruction of the Main Street hill section. This work will be funded largely with grant funding through the Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) program and Kane-Kendal Council of Mayors Surface Transportation Program (KKCOM-STP). Work is anticipated to begin in summer of 2017.

### HUNTLEY ROAD RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT (ELM TO SLEEPY HOLLOW)

Final Design is 95% complete and right-of-way acquisition is ongoing. The Village is working in conjunction with the Village of West Dundee on this project. Roadway improvements include roadway reconstruction and widening, new storm sewers, bike path improvements, and new traffic signals at Elm and Huntley Roads. This work will be funded largely with grant funding through the Kane-Kendal Council of Mayors Surface Transportation Program (KKCOM-STP). Work is anticipated to begin in summer of 2017.

### WASHINGTON AND MAIN STREETS INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT STUDY

The preliminary engineering study is complete and has been submitted to the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for review and approval. The Village has programmed the final engineering design in 2017. The design will include provisions for identified pedestrian and vehicular traffic concerns, storm water concerns, traffic flow, parking, and other related items.



## LOOKING FOR MORE WAYS TO CATCH VILLAGE OF CARPENTERSVILLE NEWS AND EVENTS?

You can now do so when driving through the intersection of Route 25 and Route 68. The Village of Carpentersville contributed \$20,000 in video gaming revenue to help the Dundee Township Park District replace the aging Bonnie Dundee Golf Course electronic sign, which is located on the southeast corner of the intersection.

## RECEIVE A DISCOUNT ON YOUR FLOOD INSURANCE

Most residents with flood insurance automatically receive a discount on their insurance premiums. The Village participates in the Community Rating System (CRS) which is a program administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in which residents living in the Special Flood Hazard Area receive a 20% discount on flood insurance premiums and residents not living in the Special Flood Hazard Area a 10% discount on flood insurance premiums. Carpentersville participated in a series of floodplain management activities in order to qualify for the CRS discount. The best part is there is no need to do anything to receive this discount. The Village has already done everything for you. Your insurance agent is notified through a national database and will automatically deduct the appropriate amount from your flood insurance premium.

As part of the CRS program the Village offers the following information on request:

- Whether a property is in or out of the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) as shown on the current Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) of the Village.
- Additional flood insurance data for a site, such as the FIRM zone and the base flood elevation or depth, if shown on the FIRM.
- A handout on the flood insurance purchase requirement that can help people who need a mortgage or loan for a property in the SFHA.
- Elevation certificates are available as of January 1, 2005.
- A link to the Fox River elevation gauge is available on the Village website at [cville.org](http://cville.org).

Direct inquiries should be made to the Community Development in Village Hall. Please supply the street address and, if available, the subdivision, lot and block number. There is no charge for this service.

There are mandatory flood insurance requirements for development in the floodplain, but for some homeowners flood insurance is an option. Flood insurance is highly recommended because no flood proofing measure is 100% foolproof. Please take time to contact your insurance carrier and consider flood insurance for your home.

# HERE COMES WINTER



Winter is quickly approaching, which means citizens need to be mindful of the health and safety hazards (both indoors and outdoors) that come with it. To help ensure everyone in our community stays safe and warm this winter, the Carpentersville Fire and Public Works Departments offer the following tips.

## SNOW & ICE CONTROL

The Village prides itself on having one of the top snow removal programs in the area. Our goal is to have all streets plowed and salted within 10 hours after the snow stops falling.

When snowfall begins, we promptly begin plowing the main arteries and hills throughout the Village, and continue to do so as the snow falls. We then move to secondary and residential streets, and finish by plowing cul-de-sacs and short dead-end streets. After the streets are plowed, salt is spread at all intersections, hills, and curves.

Please keep in mind that even after the plows have been through your area, they will continue to clean up the roadways in the following days, while also checking the roads for drifting, slick spots, and any areas missed in the initial sweep. In order to assist us as we work diligently to clear the roadways, please keep in mind the following information and tips:

- Maintain a distance of 75 to 100 feet while driving behind a snow plow.
- Snow should be cleared from fire hydrants to assist the Fire Department in case of a fire.
- Pushing or blowing snow onto Village streets is prohibited.
- **Overnight parking is prohibited from 2 AM to 6 AM.**
- Mounds of snow near driveways from the snow plows cannot be avoided, as all streets must be snowplowed from curb to curb to allow for proper drainage and mailbox access.
- To prevent your garbage can from being knocked over or hit by a snow plow place it approximately 3 feet behind the curb line.
- The postal code installation guideline for roadside mailboxes states that the front of the mailbox must be a minimum of 12 inches from the back of curb. In many cases mailboxes are damaged as a result of snow coming off the end of the plow. In these instances the Village is not responsible for the repair or replacement. However, if a mailbox complies with the postal code installation guidelines, and a plow comes in physical contact with the mailbox, the Village will repair it. ## SAFETY TIPS

- Keep emergency gear in your car, including a cell phone, flashlight, jumper cables, sand or kitty litter, ice scraper/snow brush, small shovel, blankets, and warning devices. For longer trips, take food, water, extra blankets, and required medication. Ice and snow can alter road conditions making it hard for vehicles to stop or slow down, so make sure you drive slowly, maintain a safe distance from the car in front of you, and brake earlier to ensure for a safe stop.
- Occasionally after a snowstorm, snow removal results in buried, blocked, or damaged transformers/switchgear that may result in a loss power. In order to safely access their equipment in a timely manner, ComEd asks that you make sure the equipment is clear of snow. A delay in clearing snow may result in delays in restoring power to you or your neighbor. - Disconnect garden hoses from outside faucets during the winter months. Hoses that are not removed will damage the faucet and possibly cause a leak within your home.
- Have your heating system tuned up each year. If you heat your home with a wood stove, have the chimney connection and flue checked each year and make sure the stove is placed on an approved stove board to protect your floor from heat. Your wood-burning fireplace should have a sturdy fire screen in place. Make sure your chimney and flue are inspected each year and cleaned, if needed. Do not use gas appliances such as ovens, ranges, or clothes dryers to heat your home.

#### **Jersey Mike's/American Mattress**

After many years, the vacant and dilapidated former Rosati's building was demolished this fall. By early 2017, Jersey Mike's and American Mattress will open in a newly constructed 5,500 square foot multi-tenant commercial building.

#### **Burger King**

A new Burger King with drive-through is scheduled to open by the end of the year just north of the Walgreens and Chase Bank at the Randall Rd. and Binnie Rd. intersection.

#### **Walmart Supercenter Out Lot**

(Lake Marian Rd.)

Walmart has received considerable interest in the lot immediately west of the Walgreens at the intersection of Rt. 25 and Lake Marian Rd. It is currently considering multiple offers.



### FEATURED DEVELOPMENT - WALMART

On July 22, 2015, the Village of Carpentersville issued building permits for Walmart's proposed 185,682 square foot building located at 365 Lake Marion Road. Walmart officially opened for business on June 22, 2016. A large development such as this allows the Village of Carpentersville to maintain lower property taxes for all of its residents, as the Walmart is expected to generate \$1,000,000 in sales tax revenues.

### VILLAGE LAUNCHES "SHOP C'VILLE" INITIATIVE

The Village of Carpentersville has launched its "Shop C'Ville" initiative, which was designed to create connections between Carpentersville businesses and residents. This initiative includes the launch of a mobile application and interactive directory available on the Village's website at [cville.org](http://cville.org) by clicking on the "Shop C'Ville" icon.

Businesses have the ability to create a presence through unique pages that they are able to design and update on a regular basis with information on things such as new merchandise or services, current coupon offerings, available job openings, upcoming events, etc. Those looking for a particular type of business will be able to search the interactive directory by type of service, business name, or location. Users will also be able to find the closest businesses by utilizing the location services feature on their mobile device.

This initiative will allow businesses to connect with consumers in a community-minded way, while providing consumers with one central place to find information about their favorite Carpentersville businesses and potentially help them discover new favorites.

# CARPENTERSVILLE WATER DIVISION SURVEY

(PLEASE COMPLETE AND SUBMIT)

Dear Water Customer:

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires that all water systems in the State of Illinois have an effective Cross Connection Control Program in place to protect the public water supply from contamination. Cross connections within the public water supply are a serious concern, as they can allow contaminants or pollutants to enter the public water system through what is called "backflow." Backflow occurs when a drop in water pressure causes your water to flow in the opposite direction. This can allow contaminated or polluted water to flow back into your drinking water. Given IEPA regulations and the dangers that exist from unprotected cross connections, it is necessary to establish and maintain an effective cross connection control program to protect the public water supply and its water customers. One required component in this program is a biennial survey of the water system to determine where cross connections exist. Below is a survey for your service location that we are requesting you complete and submit to the Carpentersville Water Division by mailing it to:

## **FIRE DEPARTMENT MAKES TREMENDOUS STRIDES THROUGH THE "100 DAY PLAN"**

The "100 Day Plan" was established through the collaborative effort between Village administration, the Battalion Chiefs, and executive board members of the Fire Department's full and part time unions, and prioritizes the objectives and subsequent goals to be completed by newly hired Carpentersville Fire Chief Schilling by mid-October.

The overall objectives of the plan include improving and/or increasing communication, training and safety, risk management, and personnel collaboration, which are predominately accomplished through the creation of various committees. The overarching goal of the committees was to give every member, regardless of rank, a say in the future of the fire department.

The 100 Day Plan served as a tremendous opportunity to not only align both Village and fire administration with the rank-and-file personnel, but to continue building upon the trust that has been established between the fire department leadership and the union to address the needs of the department in a cooperative manner, which in turn leads to better services for our citizens.

In an effort to continue the upward momentum within the department, the Chief and Battalion Chiefs will meet with the newly created strategic planning committee to discuss the past, present, and future of the Carpentersville Fire Department in order to identify and priority the strategic initiatives that will make up the department's strategic plan.

In addition to the creation of a strategic plan as a continuation to the 100 Day Plan, the Carpentersville Fire Department's other goals for 2017 include expanding the part-time firefighter program, re-establishing the department's commitment to training, and working cooperatively with all Village departments in an effort to increase efficiency of public safety services delivered while also reducing costs to the residents of Carpentersville.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT JOINS IN ON EFFORT TO COMBAT TEEN SUBSTANCE ABUSE**

With substance abuse as one of the major issues affecting our youth, the Carpentersville Police Department, Renz Addiction Counseling Center, and JA2SOON have decided to join together to form a coalition, now known as the Carpentersville Substance Abuse Prevention Community Coalition, in an effort to provide potentially troubled youth with the resources they need to grow up into healthy, functioning members of our society.

The Coalition is made up of community members, parents, agency providers (especially those who work directly with teens 11-18 years of age), and those who share a strong interest in the topic of substance abuse prevention. The group's goal is to bring drug abuse education and information to the Carpentersville community through a State grant obtained by the Renz Addiction Counseling Center.

Carpentersville is a growing community and we want to ensure the healthiest environment for our residents. Like many other communities in Illinois, Carpentersville has been confronted with many complex problems and issues, such as poverty, drug and alcohol abuse, and lack of health care or other vital resources. Coalitions can help create solutions to these issues with help from business owners, social organizations, government entities, and concerned citizens who are willing to work together and accomplish what individuals and organizations cannot do alone.
